Component 2 – Fostering Quality Teaching and Learning in General Education: Support to provide a learning environment that is conducive to quality education in selected general education schools.

Component 3 – *Strengthening Financing Options and Promoting Internationalization in Higher Education: Support to improve the quality and international competitiveness of higher education.*

Component 4 – System Strengthening and Stakeholder Communication: Support to facilitate a shift in attitude towards learning.

The Project will be implemented over a six-year period by the Ministry of Education, Science, Culture and Sport of Georgia (MoESCS) and its subordinate government agencies and by the Municipal Development Fund of Georgia (MDF).

The Project Management Unit (PMU) created within MoESCS supports the implementation of the Project's tasks above. The Project Management Team (PMT) created within MDF supports implementation of the separate component aimed to improve the relevant infrastructure and rehabilitate schools under the Project overall objectives.

Key Responsibilities

- Provide leadership and direction to the development, management, planning and implementation of the subcomponent 1.1. Improving Quality of Early Childhood Education (ECE) programs across the country, including preparation of work plans, budgets and other project documents;
- Serve as the primary liaison and point of contact for ECE related activities under project;
- Provide leadership in support of project activities with the goal of achieving project targets and objectives, managing effectively and efficiently both human and financial resources;
- In close coordination with Government of Georgia (GoG), relevant ministries, municipalities, development partners, and other relevant stakeholders, ensure effective project planning, management and operations;
- Report on project progress in line with set objectives and outcome indicators in close coordination with project monitoring and evaluation specialists among others to monitor and evaluate project progress and impacts;
- Collaborate with the project procurement specialists in the procurement processes, including timely provision of the required inputs for the preparation of procurement documents envisaged under subcomponents 1.1 and 1.2.
- Lead and contribute to relevant analytic studies, collection, compilation and analysis of data and project information and the preparation of regular and final reports as required by the Government and WB;
- Identify project development/implementation risks, and take effective action to resolve implementation issues and bottlenecks;
- Lead the development of scope of works and ToRs for successfully implement the project;
- Review all reports and deliverables prepared by consultants ensuring the fitness to purpose and compliance with

appropriate tasks, prepare comments and recommendations for their improvement as necessary and submit final outputs to the PMU Executive Director.

- Participate in meetings organized by MESCS and other relevant structures on subcomponent related issues.
- Manage and coordinate publicizing activities related to the subcomponent activities;
- Address social aspects in the implementation of subcomponents related to inclusion.
- Participate in the process of infrastructure standards development for new model of primary schools (encompassing pre-school classes) to make sure that core curricular demands are reflected;
- Coordinate and monitor the process of implementation of component envisaged activities including performance of consultants in charge of implementing outsourced tasks.
- Assist the PMU Executive Director in all activities related to strengthen preschool education within the frames of the project;
- Other duties as assigned by the PMU Executive Director.
